Nancy Brock DVM, DACVAA

Dr. Nancy Brock, originally from Montreal, obtained her DVM degree from the Ontario Veterinary College at the University of Guelph in 1982. She completed a residency in anesthesia and critical care at the University of California, Davis in 1988. In 1995, she became certified as a veterinary anesthesia specialist and is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiologists.

As part of her anesthesia referral practice, Dr. Brock provides veterinarians and their nursing staff with anesthesia assistance and expertise. This assistance comes in the form of telephone consultation, tele-consulting and the training of veterinarians and technicians in advanced anesthesia techniques.

Dr. Brock is a contributor to Veterinary Information Network.

She is also the author of an on-line quick reference anesthesia publication entitled <u>Veterinary</u> <u>Anesthesia Update</u> for small animal practitioners.

Kris Kruse DVM, DACVAA

Dr. Kruse received her DVM from Oregon State University in 1984. She spent a year in mixed animal practice in Seattle, WA before her residency in anesthesia at North Carolina State University. She completed her residency at NC State and was board certified as a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesia and Analgesia in 1989. Dr. Kruse remained at NC State as an NIH Postdoctoral Fellow and completed her PhD in pulmonary physiology in 1992. She joined the faculty at the University of Wisconsin School of Veterinary Medicine in 1992 and remained there as a tenured faculty member until 2006.

Since 2006 Dr. Kruse has been extensively involved in anesthesia for advanced veterinary imaging (MRI) and most recently as the anesthesiologist in charge of developing the anesthesia service for Sage Veterinary Centers, a large San Francisco Bay Area based group of specialty veterinary practices.

Given her experience in private practice along with numerous years of teaching and training veterinarians, veterinary students, and technicians, Dr. Kruse understands the challenges faced by private practice veterinarians. She recognizes the numerous opportunities to take advantage of the clinical anesthesia environment for in-hospital teaching and training in anesthesia and analgesia. She is also ready to assist practitioners in using advanced anesthesia service as a means of attracting and retaining clients.

Dr. Kruse has authored numerous original research papers and book chapters, has lectured locally and nationally on anesthesia and analgesia, and is an ongoing teacher and consultant on the Veterinary Information Network and other platforms.
