# **OVERVIEW**

The laboratory session will focus on canine and feline local anesthetic techniques that you can use every day in your practice to enhance patient comfort.

# DETAILS

Techniques using both canine and feline cadavers include:

- Incision and infiltration blocks (spay)
- Testicular blocks (neuter)
- Sacro coccygeal blocks
- Axillary blocks
- Intercostal blocks
- Metacarpal blocks
- Epidural blocks
- Soaker catheter placement and management
